


Visit Baltimore safer meetings platform

Health Safety Guide for Event Attendees



Baltimore's hospitality community is ready and eager to welcome you Charm City. Our hotels, restaurants, theaters, historic sites and attractions have modified their cleaning and sanitizing programs and created safer waiting cues. Baltimore's hospitality partners have risen to the occasion, many of them certified by the Global Biorisk Advisory Council and recognized as "GBAC STAR™" facilities, including the Baltimore Convention Center. Arriving by plane?

Welcome to Baltimore/Washington International Airport (BWI)

Awareness Campaign which includes the installation of plexiglass partitions where passenger and employee interactions are increased. Dozens of floor signs have been installed to remind people of the social distancing protocol. Convenient hand sanitizing stations have been installed throughout all public areas. BWI has installed vending machines that dispense personal protective equipment (PPE). Shuttle buses are more frequent with larger vehicles, and rental cars are all completely sanitized after they are returned. Only ticketed passengers and employees are allowed in the terminals and mask use is mandatory. Click here to see a quick video of BWI's Safety Awareness Campaign. BWI is also served by Light Rail running from the International Terminal to downtown Baltimore for \$1.90 per trip. Mask use is mandatory on light rail, in taxis and ride shares. Amtrak and MARC Rail Service

Baltimore is served by Amtrak rail as well as MARC which serves customers from surrounding states. Penn Station in Baltimore's hip Station North neighborhood is a full-service station with food service, taxi, Uber, Lyft and Baltimore's free Charm City Circulator bus service. Penn Station is conveniently located 10 minutes away from most hotels. MARC runs seven days a week between Camden Yards and Union Station in Washington, D.C. Transportation

Baltimore's **Charm City Circulator** is a free local bus that runs on four separate routes. Care has been taken to make sure buses are disinfected after every full route. Bus routes start downtown and travel to many different neighborhoods.

Baltimore taxi companies are utilizing smartphone apps such as Yellow cab's **ZTRIP** application, and are sanitizing vehicles after each trip.

Lyft and Uber are rideshare applications and most Baltimoreans prefer these to driving themselves. Both companies have ramped up sanitation and cleanliness as well as improving their apps with updated driver and rider regulations. 
